
Want To Reduce Your Water Usage? - Experts from the Water Wise Program, University of Arizona – Cochise County Cooperative Extension will be offering a series of classes in May to help residents conserve water. Classes will be held on Saturdays at the library from 10 am to 12 pm. The first, on May 4th, will cover Indoor Conservation. The second, on May 11th, will cover Xeriscaping and the last one on May 25th will be on Rain Harvesting.

E-Rate Update – CenturyLink has performed their site survey. The project is estimated to be completed between April 4th and May 16th. The new fiber will provide a lightning-speed 500 Mbps internet connection--42x faster than our current 12 Mbps connection! Access to faster internet has the potential to transform the quality and types of services we offer our patrons.

Town History Project – The library will be applying for grant funding to create a digital history repository for the Town of Huachuca City. Historical photos and documents will be scanned and put on a website to make them easily accessible to the entire community. Part of the project will include oral histories of long-time residents. PUBLIC SAFETY NEWS - With the transition of our Dispatch

Operations to the Southeastern Arizona Communications Center (SEACOM), the Huachuca City Police Department (HCPD) would like to inform citizens with emergencies to **DIAL 911**. This option will connect you to dispatch. If you come to the Huachuca City Police Department after hours, pick up the RED PHONE in the lobby and your call will automatically be routed to 911 dispatch. Our general administration line (456-1353) will still be available Monday – Friday, 8 am – 5 pm, but should **not** be used for emergencies. As a reminder, police and fire are on duty 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
