The Huachuca City Police Department Makes Arrest in Arson Case: December 5, 2018

On Tuesday December 4, 2018 at approximately 4:10 pm, officers from the Huachuca City Police Department (HCPD) arrested 18-year-old Sierra Vista resident, Hailie S. Serr, as part of an ongoing investigation into the arson fires, criminal damage and trespassing of the Huachuca City Methodist Church. A connection to criminal activity at other locations within Huachuca City during this same period is also being reviewed.

The fires involving the Huachuca City Methodist Church located at 506 N. Gila Street were reported on October 18, 2018 and November 27, 2018. One brush fire near the Huachuca City Methodist Church was also reported in October. HCPD received reports of additional criminal activity including, but not limited to, criminal damage and trespassing during this same time period. All of these criminal incidents have been part of an ongoing investigation by HCPD in conjunction with the Whetstone Fire District and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF). Significant leads were developed through this collaboration which resulted in the arrest of Hailie Serr. On December 4, 2018 Serr was arrested and booked into the Cochise County Jail on the following Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) charges:

13-1703A - Arson of Structure / Property	Felony	2 Counts
13-1506A1 - Burglary 3 rd Deg-Unlaw Entry	Felony	2 Counts
13-1604A1 - AGG CRIM DMGE-Deface Worship	Felony	2 Counts
13-1504A5 – CRIM TRESP 1 st DEG Desecrate	Felony	2 Counts

Huachuca City citizens have referred to the Huachuca City Methodist Church (known to many as *The Church on the Hill*) as being a beacon of light for all who have come to Huachuca City throughout the previous 70 plus years. The Huachuca City Police Department has spent a significant amount of time and resources developing these investigations. Additional arrests are pending the review of related incidents by the Cochise County Attorney's Office.

HCPD and the Town of Huachuca City sincerely appreciate the efforts of the men and women from the Whetstone Fire District and the ATF. HCPD anticipates bringing the investigation to a successful conclusion soon.
